### From the Desk of The Senior Warden

Dear Friends,

News from the Diocese has not changed. They are suggesting that we continue having services which are broadcasts rather than in person. Your Vestry feels that the Zoom services are sufficient for now. We are looking into parking lot services, however we have not moved past the planning stages yet. We are also looking toward interior services, not for dates, but looking instead at cleaning services and equipment which will need to be purchased. I would imagine that little will change until a vaccine that works is available.

I hope many of you have been following us on Zoom. We have changed our schedule somewhat, changing our "Coffee Hour" from 5:00 pm on Sunday to 11:30 am just after the Rite 2 service. So our Zoom schedule is now:

Your Vestry has completed the 2019 audit. We will be submitting it to the Diocese shortly. This is an annual occurrence. Jo Ann Blackstock, Teresa Hale, and I were the auditors this year. For those of you who don't know, the Diocesan Canons allow an internal audit for two consecutive years with the third year requiring an external audit.

We are continuing to provide food through our food pantry. We do need help at this time with so many people out of work. We will be glad to accept canned food or money to purchase items. Just make out a check to St. Augustine's for Food Pantry. Thanks

Frank will be retiring from Gardening at the end of this year. If you know of a gardener who charges a reasonable price, please email me his name and phone number.

This is a special time of year for all of us. We are voting for our President, Senators, Congressmen/Congresswomen, and locally for a myriad of positions and Constitutional Amendments. Everything counts. Please vote. You can vote in person at many different times, it is also easy to vote absentee ballot. If you have any questions, contact your County Registrar. October 5 is the last day to register to vote on November 3.

We are also in the midst of the Census. The Census is taken only once every 10 years. It is extremely important. It is used for appropriations, determining our representative count in Congress, plus the number of electors we have for the Presidential Election. This number determines how much money the State of Georgia receives from our federal taxes. If you haven't filled out your Census form, please do so. You can also fill out your census form on line and by phone (by calling 844-330-2020). And remember, all personnel information is confidential. There is no citizenship question on the Census.

## Are You A Registered Georgia Voter?

If not, there's still time to get registered. In order to vote in the upcoming general election, November 3, you must be a registered voter. Whether you plan to vote in person or via absentee ballot you should be mindful of the following dates/deadlines.

The deadline for mail-in is October 5. Mail in requests must be postmarked by October 5, and online registration must be done also, by October 5. You can register online here: <a href="https://registertovote.sos.ga.gov/GAOLVR/beginRegistration.do">https://registertovote.sos.ga.gov/GAOLVR/beginRegistration.do</a>

The deadline for requesting an absentee ballot is October 30. Completed ballots should be postmarked by November 3, 7:00 p.m. You may also return in person on November 3, by 7:00 p.m.

#### Early voting is Oct. 12 thru Oct. 30.

# Presiding Bishop's 'Love Is the Way' book generates media buzz, from NPR to People to Brené Brown


[Episcopal News Service] Presiding Bishop Michael Curry first achieved a bit of global celebrity in 2018 after his "Power of Love" sermon at the royal wedding. National and international media outlets clamored to interview him about the sermon, which had offered some of the most memorable and uplifting moments from those high-profile nuptials.

This year, Curry is again making the rounds of interviews, from NPR to People magazine, this time to support the release of his new book, "Love Is the Way."

That wedding sermon remains a popular topic of interviewers, and as Curry told People, he has drawn inspiration from the conversations it generated.

"In two years, I've had more of those kinds of conversations about faith and life and love, than I had in 40 years," he said in the People interview, published online last week.

NPR's Lulu Garcia-Navarro caught up with Curry for an interview on "Weekend Edition" that aired on Sept. 20. On NBC, Curry appeared by video Sept. 22 to talk with "Today Show" host Hoda Kotb. And Curry spoke by phone with Episcopal News Service for a Q&A about the book, also on Sept. 22, the day the book was released.
